Dr. P. Vasanthi, Chairman, BOS, extended a cordial welcome to all the members of Board of Studies. She briefed the members about the importance of redesigning the curriculum and syllabi of B.Tech. in Civil Engineering, M.Tech. Structural Engineering and M.Tech. Construction Engineering and Project Management. After the introductory remarks, the agenda items were taken up for discussion by the members of the Board of Studies.

#### ITEM 10.1

To consider and approve the revised curriculum and syllabi of B.Tech. Civil Engineering (VII & VIII Semester) under Regulations 2017.

The following suggestions were put forth by Mr. B. Suresh, CEO & Managing Director, M/S. Mahindra Consulting Engineers Pvt. Ltd., Chennai

 The course Estimation and Costing to be retitled as Estimation and Costing of Infrastructure Projects.

- Estimation of Irrigation structures should be added in Module III of the course Estimation and Costing.
- Module VI to be retitled as Valuation and Report preparation for the course Estimation and Costing.
- Separate module may be added as Estimation of Infrastructure projects for the course Estimation and Costing.
- The course construction Engineering and project management should be retitled as Infrastructure and construction management.
- Case studies should be included for the course construction Engineering and project management
- Textbooks / References by foreign authors should be added for the course construction Engineering and project management

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- In the syllabus of construction Engineering and project management, separate module can be added for infrastructure projects.
- Module VI to be retitled as Ground Water Extraction for the course Ground Water Engineering.
- In the syllabus of Environmental Impact Assessment course, Topics on ESMF, Social Impact Monitoring and Ministry of Environmental Forest guidelines may be included.
- The course on Coastal Engineering may be removed since its too high for B.Tech Civil Engineering.
- The course on GIS & its Applications is to be retitled as GIS in Infrastructure Engineering.
- The course on Flood Management is to be retitled as Storm water and Flood Management.
- In syllabus of Contract laws and Regulations, Topics on Construction agreement,RFT, RFQ, BOT, BOOT, PPP, Awarding Infrastructure Projects,Contract award process and Legal requirement may be included.

The following suggestions were put forth by Mr. Suman Dhas, Senior Project Engineer, L & T, Chennai.

Pre read material should be provided for the course Earthquake Engineering.

The following suggestions were put forth by Mr. C.S. Narayanan, Vice President, M/S. Mahindra Consulting Engineers Pvt. Ltd., Chennai

• For the course Industrial structures, Pre Engineered structures can be added.

### The following suggestions were put forth by Dr.M.S.Haji Sheik Mohammed, Professor & Dean (AA)

- Considering the booming of Repair and Rehabilitation market, the course " Repair and Rehabilitation of structures" can be brought under core course instead of Elective.
- In the syllabus of "Repair and Rehabilitation of structures", micro concrete can be added under repair material and sacrificial anode cathodic protection under repair technique.
- Repair and Rehabilitation of buildings can be offered as certificate course in Department of Civil Engineering

After detailed discussions, it was resolved to approve the revised syllabi of **B.Tech**. **Civil Engineering** and recommend the same for approval by the Academic Council of the University. This will come into effect from the academic year 2019-2020 onwards.

The curriculum is enclosed in Annexure 11.1.1.

#### ITEM 11.2

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### To consider and approve the M.Tech (Research) programme

Offering of M.Tech (Research) will have the following advantages

- Facilitate Industrial People to get Masters degree with more research component and less courses
- Research oriented leading to more publications

After detailed discussions, it was resolved to approve M.Tech (Research) and recommend the same for approval by the Academic Council of the University. This will come into effect from the academic year 2019-2020 onwards.

#### ITEM 11.3

To consider and ratify the elective course for M.Tech Structural Engineering under Regulations 2016.

The course on "Fire Protection, Services and Maintenance Management of Building" offered by the NPTEL was taken by the students of M.Tech Structural Engineering and Construction Engineering & Project Management. The course is equivalent to elctive courses offered in M.Tech Structural Engineering and M. Tech. Construction Engineering & Project Management and is found to be very useful to the students.

#### Item 11.1: Confirmation of the minutes of the previous meeting.

The Board **resolved to confirm** the minutes of the tenth meeting held on 18-07-18. The confirmed minutes are given in Annexure I.

## <u>Item 11.2</u>: Updating elective courses in B.Tech. (IT) of 2017 Regulation and M.Tech. (IT) of 2016 Regulation.

The elective courses on latest technologies were included in the VI & VII of B.Tech – IT 2017 Regulation and III semester of M.Tech – IT 2016 Regulation. It was resolved to approve the updated syllabi. The updated Syllabi of B.Tech. (IT) is given in Annexure II. and M.Tech (IT) is given in Annexure III.

The details of discussion in the meeting are given below.

- Dr. Sathik Ali, HOD/IT, and Dr. K. Murugan, Anna University, suggested to include a course, TCP/IP Protocol for B.Tech. – IT, since the Internet applications keep on increasing and IT engineer must be aware of TCP/IP Protocols.
- Dr. G. Kavitha, suggested to include a course, Blockchain Technology for B.Tech IT students, hence the industry demands understanding the Blockchain technology which shall be very useful for developing real world applications.

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- Based on a request by third year of B.Tech IT students, the board recommended to include a course, Artificial Intelligence for Data Science for B.Tech. – IT.
- Nowadays, job opportunities for IoT and Industry 4.0 are more. Dr. N. Prakash, suggested to include a course, Introduction to Industry 4.0 and Industrial IoT for the B.Tech – IT students.
- In order to meet the technological advancement happening in IT field, Dr. M. Kabeer suggested to include the following courses for M.Tech – IT students.
  - Big Data Analytics for IoT
  - o Blockchain Architecture and Use Cases

# Item 11.3: Discussion about modification of the curriculum framework according to AICTE model curriculum.

Modification of the B.Tech. (IT) curriculum framework according to AICTE model curriculum was discussed Dr. K. Murugan and Mr. I. Arockia Doss recommended to focus more on adding the courses related with the emerging areas like **Big Data Analytics**, **Machine Learning and Artificial Intelligence**. The members suggested to reduce the credit from 178 to around 160. It was resolved to modify the curriculum framework in the next meeting of Board of Studies.

## Item 11.4: Any other item with permission of the Chairman.

Dr. K. Murugan recommended to reduce the credit for B.Tech. – IT courses and also suggested to award B.Tech (Honors) degree if students score more than 20 credits additionally.

Mr. I. Arockia Doss suggested to encourage the students to enroll courses in MOOC, NPTEL, SWAYAM.

It was resolved to incorporate the suggestion in the syllabi.
