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EDUCATIONAL VISIT FOR LAW STUDENTS

Exploring the Central Prison

The students of B.A. LL.B. and B.B.A. LL.B (IV semester) from the Crescent School of Law recently visited the Central Prison in Chennai. This insightful visit was organized as part of their academic curriculum on February 9th, 2023 (Thursday).

Accompanied by four faculty members, the students embarked on their journey from the University Campus in Vandalur, commencing at 10:00 am. They reached the Central Prison at 11:15 am. The prison officials conducted thorough security checks, including verifying the two-dose vaccine certificates. As a safety measure, students were instructed not to carry any phones, metal gadgets, or instruments during the visit.

To ensure a fruitful experience, police officers were assigned to guide and address any queries the students had. These officers prioritized student safety and maintained a patient and respectful demeanour throughout the visit, making it an enriching and engaging experience. The prison visit provided a unique opportunity for the students to explore various areas within the facility, including the Rehabilitation Centre, Gallows, School, Bakery, Weaving Place, A-Block Prison, Binding, Food Preparation Area, Shoe Manufacturing Area and the Hospital. The students found this visit highly informative and intriguing, broadening their understanding of the corrections system and its functioning.




INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY

School of Mechanical Science

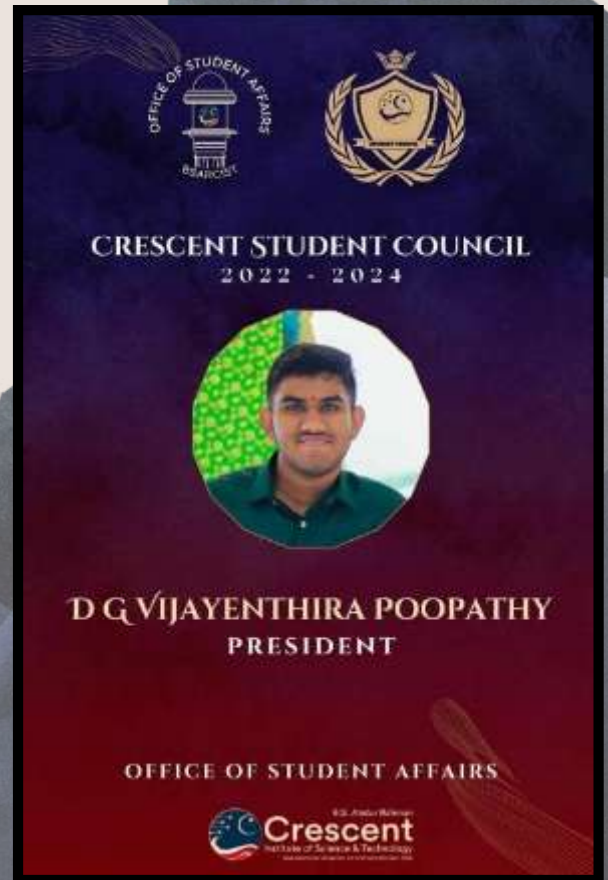


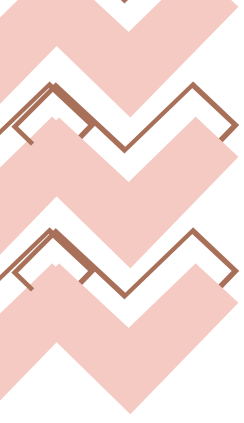

STUDENT COUNCIL 2023 - 24

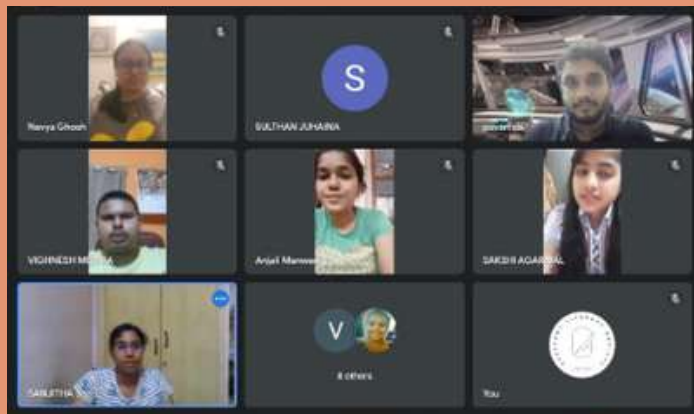
