GARAM: The initial stage characterized by high enthusiasm and adherence to theoretical principles, often leading to challenges.

NARAM: A period of tempered enthusiasm where practical aspects of service are understood and adapted.

BESHARAM: The undesirable stage marked by corruption and unprofessional behavior. Rangarajan stressed the importance of avoiding this stage to maintain integrity and effectiveness in service.

Book Introduction: Shri.Rangarajan introduced his newly authored book, Polity Simplified. The book is designed to simplify the complex subject of Polity and Governance through mnemonics and examples, aiding in easier comprehension and retention for civil service aspirants.



Interactive Session and Q&A

Towards the end of the workshop, R. Rangarajan engaged with the audience through a Q&A session. He addressed various questions and queries from students, providing valuable advice and insights on preparing for civil services and navigating a career in the public sector.
