

#### International Workshop on In-Silico Molecular Modelling and Simulation

The School of Life Sciences, in collaboration with the Association of Cancer Research and Education (ACER), hosted a prestigious **two-day international workshop** focusing on in-silico molecular modelling and simulation. The workshop took place on **9th and 10th July 2024. Dr. Ashok Kumar,** the organizing secretary, extended a cordial welcome to all attendees. The workshop was inaugurated by the chief guest, Dr. Balaji Nagarajan, an Affiliate Assistant Professor at the Institute of Structural Biology, Drug Discovery and Development, Department of Medicinal Chemistry at Virginia Commonwealth University, Virginia, USA. He was honoured by **Dr S. Hemalatha,** the Convenor.

The workshop covered a plethora of topics including the fundamentals of protein structure, retrieving protein structure from the PDB database and applying the Chimera tool for molecular modelling. Participants also had the opportunity to explore 3D structure modelling of proteins, molecular docking, and the interpretation of molecular docking results using both Chimera and Ligplot. Additionally, the workshop delved into Molecular Dynamics Simulation (MDS), specifically utilizing NAMD for a small peptide and analyzing MDS results using VMD. The workshop also highlighted the use of GNU plots, an innovative and powerful plotting method.

Thirty participants, including thirteen individuals from external institutes and seventeen research scholars and faculty members from BSACIST, took part in the workshop. During the valedictory session, Dr. S. Hemalatha presented certificates to the participants, recognizing their active participation and engagement.

The Department of English conducted the inaugural function of the Crescent Literarian Hub (CLH) for the academic year 2024-2025.




AUGUST







