

Club Activities of BSACIST

B.S. Abdur Rahman Crescent Institute of Science and Technology (BSACIST) actively promotes sustainable development goals (SDGs) through various student club activities, as evidenced in the provided reports. These activities span across multiple SDGs, demonstrating a comprehensive approach to sustainability.

Several clubs organized events directly contributing to SDG 7 (Affordable and Clean Energy) and SDG 13 (Climate Action). The policy for divesting from carbon-intensive energy industries reflects a commitment to SDG 7 by promoting sustainable energy practices. The "Pasumai Valarpom" and "Pasumai Valarpom 2.0" tree plantation drives directly contribute to SDG 13 by enhancing the campus's green cover and promoting ecological balance. Furthermore, Crescent Global Outreach Mission, in collaboration with Crescent Creative Strokes, hosted an event on World Tsunami Awareness Day (November 5, 2024), focusing on Global Warming and Tsunami Preparedness. The event featured a guest lecture by Dr. Purnima Jaliha from NIOT, Chennai, who shared insights on tsunami warning systems. Dr. E. Syed Mohamed also presented a seminar on Global Warming, emphasizing the need to mitigate climate change. A new book, "Tsunamis Unveiled: Exploring Models, Warnings & Global Systems," was released at the event. A Global Warming Awareness Program was also conducted at Popali Raja Government Higher Secondary School, Puzal, Chennai, on August 17, 2023, by Crescent Creative Strokes Club in collaboration with Amal Foundation. This program involved creating informative charts and presentations to educate young students about the causes, effects, and solutions of global warming.

SDG 4 (Quality Education) is addressed through educational outreach activities. The Crescent Creative Strokes Club's "Mud Magic" pottery workshop, in collaboration with Studio Pottery Paradise, promotes traditional artistic forms and aligns with SDG goals. The Crescentian Voice Channel, in association with MIT Square, London, and the RAISE Centre of Excellence, delivers engaging broadcasts, fostering international connections and promoting excellence in broadcasting, contributing to SDG 4. Additionally, CRESMUN conducted a workshop titled "Phase 1: MUN Insight" on February 29, 2024, providing a comprehensive introduction to Model United Nations, covering MUN procedures, public speaking, and diplomatic negotiation techniques.

SDG 5 (Gender Equality) is supported through events like "Empower Her" organized by Rotaract Club.

SDG 6 (Clean Water and Sanitation) is indirectly addressed through the promotion of conscious water usage, although specific events are not detailed in the provided snippets.

SDG 12 (Responsible Consumption and Production) is promoted through initiatives like reducing plastic waste on campus, although specific details are not provided in the snippets.

2. PASUMAI VALARPOM 2.0

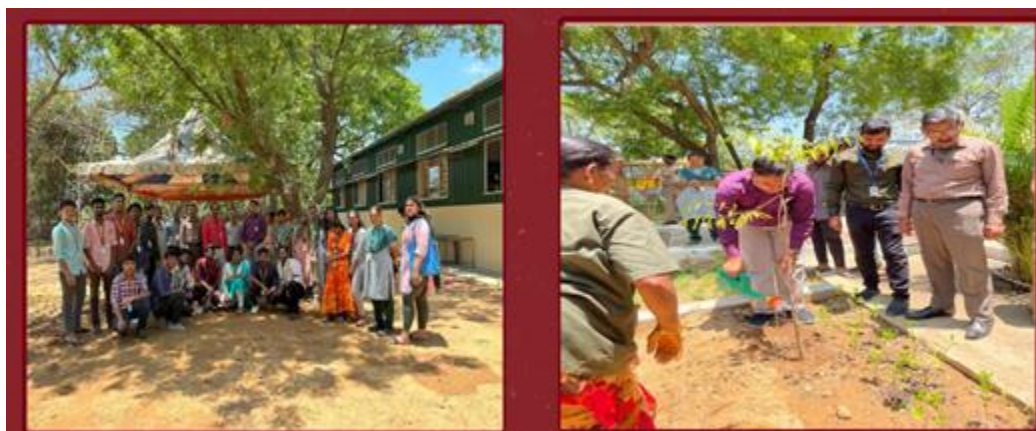

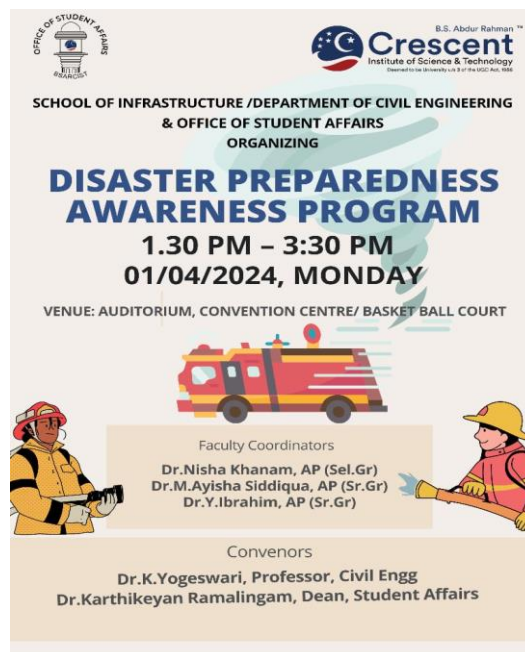

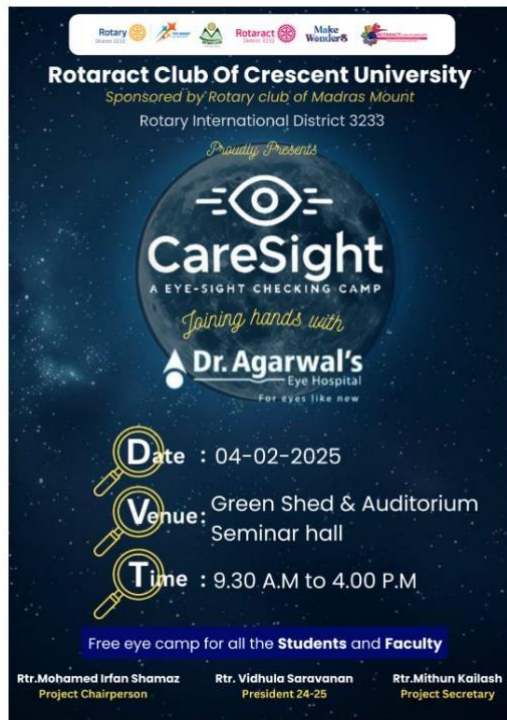


7. Commencement of Camp (12.00 PM):
