The National Service Scheme, B.S. Abdur Rahman Crescent Institute of Science and Technology successfully organized a "Mega Cleaning Drive" on the 30th of September, 2024.

The camp was a part of the nationwide initiative "Swachhata Hi Seva 2024," aiming to create awareness and to take significant steps towards a cleaner environment. The drive was led by **Dr. Ayub Khan Dawood, NSS Coordinator**, who welcomed the volunteers and motivated them with an inspiring address, elaborating on the mission and impact of the Swachhata Hi Seva campaign.

The event saw enthusiastic participation from group of dedicated students, who were divided into three teams to tackle different locations around Vandalur. These locations included the areas in front of Arignar Anna Zoological Park, the Vandalur Bus Stand, and the surrounding premises of the Indian Overseas Bank (IoB). The students focused primarily on removing plastic waste and litter, emphasizing the importance of reducing plastic pollution and maintaining public spaces.

Under the guidance of the NSS Programme Officers, Dr. R. Anitha, Dr. C. Srinivasan, and Dr. C. Noushad, the volunteers worked diligently throughout the day. They were equipped with gloves, trash bags, and necessary cleaning tools, and divided tasks to ensure the areas were thoroughly cleaned. The drive covered a wide range of waste materials, predominantly plastic bottles, wrappers, and other non-biodegradable refuse. This hands-on experience allowed students to recognize the extent of littering and pollution in public areas while making a tangible contribution to their community.

Dr. T. Murugesan, Vice-Chancellor, and Dr. N. Raja Hussain, Registrar, also visited the camp and took the opportunity to encourage the volunteers for their dedication and hard work. They highlighted the importance of cleanliness drives like this in creating a better, sustainable future and applauded the students for taking part







in such a noble initiative. Their presence boosted the morale of the volunteers, making the event more impactful.

The event started with a briefing session at 11AM, where students gathered at the institute before proceeding to the designated areas. Dr. Ayub Khan Dawood explained the objectives of the camp—promoting community engagement, spreading awareness regarding the significance of public cleanliness, and reinforcing the ideals of Swachh Bharat. Each of the three teams, led by their respective NSS officers, then moved to their designated areas to begin their work.
