Plastic pollution on beaches can have a variety of effects on coastal creatures, including:

- It endangers aquatic species that can consume it.
- Piles of plastic can form an insulating layer that boosts temperatures to unsustainable levels.
- Hermit crabs are dying by the tens of thousands because they mistake plastic for their habitat.
- Plastic currently accounts for 85% of all marine litter. It will nearly triple by 2040, contributing 23-37 million metric tons of rubbish to the ocean each year.








