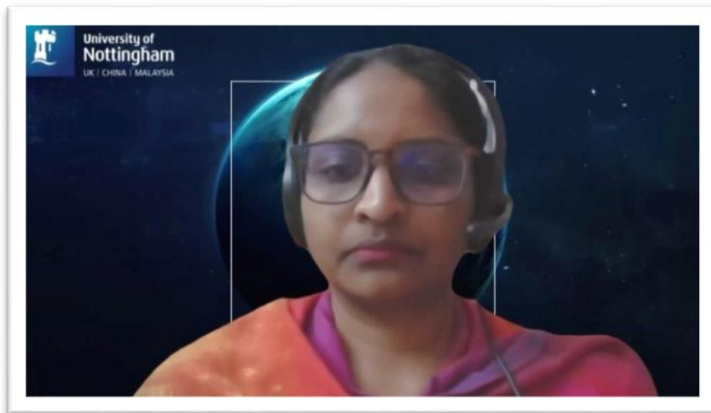

PLENARY TALK: GREENING THE CURRICULUM: IMPLICATIONS FOR TEACHING AND LEARNING WITHIN HIGHER EDUCATION

The major academic highlight of Day 1 was the Plenary Talk delivered from 11:30 a.m. to 12:45 p.m. The session featured eminent scholar Dr. Subarna Sivapalan, FRSA, SFHEA, Associate Dean, Research and Knowledge Exchange, and Co-Chair, UNESCO Chair in International Education and Development, University of Nottingham Malaysia. Her talk titled “Greening the Curriculum: Implications for Teaching and Learning within Higher Education” explored the urgent need for academia to integrate sustainability principles into teaching practices.

Dr. Sivapalan emphasized how ecological consciousness must become foundational to curriculum design, influencing both pedagogical methods and institutional policies. Her presentation drew significant engagement from participants, stimulating dialogue on the role of language and literature in eco-critical thought and environmental activism.

PAPER PRESENTATIONS

The sessions encouraged rich academic discourse among participants, providing ample room for research exchange.

At 11:00 a.m., the conference hosted a highly engaging and forward-looking workshop led by Dr. Anuradha Prashant, Consumer Research Consultant and Communication Skills Trainer at Cambridge ESOL. Her workshop titled “Futuristic Classrooms: Empowering Global Citizens in a Digital World” explored the evolving educational landscape shaped by technological innovation.
